Hope Scope

⁴Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. ⁵You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might.

Deuteronomy 6:4-5 (NRSV)

The commandment above is what Jesus calls the first and greatest commandment, and it is very similar to the first of the Ten Commandments given in Exodus 20. It would be hard to deny that understanding God to be God alone, worthy of our love and obedience is—and must be—at the top of the list for faithful people. And I doubt that many of us would disagree with that.

But God also calls us to a particular life together. And the life we are called to has us worshipping together (Hebrews 10). More and more, Christians seem to feel that worship together is optional. I am a great advocate of the use of technology to enhance all that we do as faithful Christians. And the fact that people can watch and listen to our service online is a true benefit to the church. I make use of our online service myself when I am away. And if a person cannot be together with the church physically, I think our online service is the next best thing.

But next best is not the same as best. And so, I am afraid that we are perhaps too ready to substitute worshipping together with watching worship from home, or elsewhere. They are not the same. "Liturgy" which is just the form our worship takes, means "the work of the people." Worship is what we do when we come together on Sunday morning, and it is meant to be an event that commands all our attention, and has us all taking part.

Physical presence is always important to Christians and Christian communities. Perhaps the greatest gift of our faith is that Jesus is the physical presence of God with us. We are meant to be together. And this means at least two things for us. First, those who cannot be with us physically are not to be forgotten or ignored, but visited and made to feel a part of the community. And second, we should be together, physically, when that is possible.

So, if you have not been with us recently on Sunday mornings, I have given you some theological reasons why it might be a good idea to change that habit. But here's a non-theological one: Our time together, limited as it is, is great. Sometimes I look around at how the people of this church greet each other, treat each other, and look after each other. It is a marvel. So, if you have not been attending regularly (or at all) please come. It is a joy for us all to be together, and that joy would only be increased by your presence with us.

Youth Retreat Report-taken from Feb. 15 Valley Bridge Newsletter

It's official. The Presbytery of Minnesota Valleys has just concluded its first ever, one-of-a-kind youth retreat this past weekend, February 10 & 11 at the First Presbyterian Church of Willmar! If you read the Valley Bridge, you have seen our event evolve in so many ways. From leaders to times, to how it would look, and everything in between.

All Presbytery youth, grades 6-12 were invited to spend the weekend at this event planned around the Matthew 25 theme "When Did We See You?". Activities included large and small group fun, meaningful worship services, with communion on Saturday, great food and lots of wonderful fellowship together. Friday's activities centered around the idea of "See and Be Seen" while on Saturday we learned what it means to "Know and Be Known." These are wonderful resources for every church. If you would like more information on how and where to find these, please contact any one of us.

Back in October we learned of an event support grant of \$1,000 being offered by the Presbyterian Youth Triennium (PYT)/Presbytery Mission Agencies to groups who would be open to hosting an event using PYT connect resources they provided. The grant money awarded to each recipient would come from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Pentecost offering funds.

Kali Luther, our Presbytery Youth Coordinator at the time, applied for and received this grant, which ultimately was used to purchase baby items and household goods to be distributed to a fellowship of single women from South-Sudan and Ethiopia who live in the St. Cloud, Minnesota area who practice their prayers of faith at the First Presbyterian Church of St. Cloud. We were extremely happy to welcome the Rev. Elizabeth Tot and Nyanwa, one of her mothers, who joined us on Saturday to talk about the challenges these women face living in the United States, while trying to make a living for themselves and their children. The youth packaged up all of the items in boxes and sent them with Elizabeth and Nyanwa to bring back to St. Cloud and their community of single mothers.

A special thanks of gratitude to the Presbytery for sponsoring this event, to the Willmar church for hosting it, to Kali for envisioning it, to the 14 youth and 7 adults who attended it, including our new Clearwater Forest Camp Executive Director Erin Anderson and Assistant Camp Program Director Garrett Colten, and to the Agencies for the event support grant, their creative resources and gift bag swag! All were necessary to make this event successful – and we think it scored a 10 out of 10!

February 2023 Updates



Volunteer Opportunities: If you or someone you know would like to be a part of The Link's mission and volunteer at the **Community Revival Boutique and Thrift**, we are looking for extra help on-call and on a consistent basis (mostly Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays). Our store hours are 10-3 Wednesday-Friday and 10-2 Saturdays. Our current volunteers are amazing and have a great time together building friendships. If you'd like to join the fun, call Shawna at 320-347-1047 or Ashley at 320-354-5465.

In January, The Link was able to serve 8 families with common household needs with our **Household Exchange Program**. The Household Exchange program takes in donations such as smaller furniture, bedding, towels, kitchen utensils, pots and pans etc. to provide families when they are getting back on their feet.

The Food Pantry served 75 households in January (including: 124 adults, 72 children and 25 seniors) and distributed a total of 3,858.5 pounds of food. The need of food has increased significantly the past couple months, requiring The Link to increase their food budget to meet the needs of the people served.

The Wildcat Backpack Program is currently serving 86 children. Each week, students from the NL-S High School pack bags including: 2 juices, 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 2 snacks, 1 fruit and 1 treat, and deliver them to each school to ensure our students nutritional needs are met on the weekends when they are not in school. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555 or Vicki Mickelson at NLS schools at 320-354-2252 ext. 2607.

The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 10 families in February by helping with medical bills, utility bills and rental payments. This program also connected families with financial resources outside of The Link to help with bigger bills and necessities, including housing for homeless families.
