## Hope Scope

One generation shall laud your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts. On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate.

The might of your awesome deeds shall be proclaimed, and I will declare your greatness. Psalm 145:4-6 (NRSV)

Spring has finally sprung (in fact, this past week looked more like mid-summer thunderstorm season), and there is at least a lull in the pandemic. Our worship services show something of the joy we have at being able to sing and pray and praise God together. Much is good. And the longer I am here, the more I see that we at Hope Presbyterian Church have a story to tell. It is a good story.

And I usually think of that story as one that we need to get out to the larger community, which I think it is. But today's reading from Psalm 145 says that we not only want to tell the story to the outside community. We also want to tell it from one generation to the next.

This is a terribly important mission of ours—to make sure we raise yet another generation of people who know and understand the promises of God, the power of God's love, and the joy we have all found in the grace that has been bestowed upon us. This is why we have Christian education and youth programs in the church. And this is why they matter.

Experts tell us that while some people have just lost interest in the church, much of the decline in the church in the U.S. has to do with the fact that we are just not replacing Christians who die. Relatively few people are leaving the church altogether. But also, relatively few young people are joining in with us. For some reason, the church is having trouble lauding God's works and declaring God's mighty acts to another generation. The church in the U.S. is struggling to talk meaningfully about God and our relationship with God to younger people.

This is not a small problem. It is a major one. Our Christian education programs have slowed for the summer, but have not stopped. We will have three family fun festivals this summer and you are all invited. I have long thought that the relationships we form with young people in the church are among the most important, because when a young person knows, trusts, and loves another person in the church, it is easier for that one to see the love of God that is present here.

I encourage you all to do what you can to develop important relationships with the children, youth, and young adults in our congregation. It might be the most important mission work you ever do.

At its May 2nd meeting, the Session:

- \* Approved keeping the congregation informed of the church's financial situation by publishing year-to-date income and expenses in the bulletin and on the screen on the second Sunday of each month and monthly in the Hope Scope.
  - \* Discussed the importance of outreach to the community.
- \* Was informed that Rev. Allen Jergenson was assigned as the liaison for Hope Church by the Presbytery's Congregational Nurture Committee to develop a relationship with the Presbytery, create a network of support for the church and its pastor and to address any special needs or concerns as they may arise.



- \* Approved the Christian Education, Youth and Families Committee holding Family Festivals on June 22, July 20 and August 17 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. and that they be open to the public.
- \* Approved paying the Tier 3 level (\$620) per baptized member who attends Clearwater Forest Camp in 2022 with the requirement that the families pay the first \$100 of the fee per child.
  - \* Was informed new outdoor speakers were installed in the Hopewood Chapel.
- \* Discussed the Easter breakfast and decided that in the future, we will only serve muffins with juice and coffee rather than a full breakfast.
- \* Approved Pastor Jones taking vacation May 31-June 6 and June 27-July 4.
