Then turning to the disciples, Jesus said to them privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it."

Luke 10:23-24 (NRSV)

You and I are blessed. This is true in many ways, of course, but look at Jesus' words here in Luke's Gospel. Jesus' disciples are given eyes to see things that others do not see. That means that they (we!) can see things others cannot. We have seen things that many in the history of the world longed to see, but never did. Even Kings and prophets sought to see what we see, but never did.

Every time we see the Spirit at work in the world—every time we see the light of Christ shining, every time we see the love of Christ passed on to another, we are seeing something that some cannot see, and that others had longed to see. It is a gift.

And we know that God gives us gifts out of love, for sure. But also, God has God's own purposes. And so what, besides love, does God hope to achieve in granting us these eyes that see?

Our theology tells us that God's grace and goodness always come first, and that our good works arise out of our thankfulness for that grace and goodness. We love because God first loved us. (1John 4:19) We serve because we have been served. We give because we have been given to. We forgive because God has forgiven us.

It finally seems like we are (maybe) done with winter, though as I write this, frost is predicted up north! But can we look out at beauty and glory of a Minnesota springtime? Can we see the love we all share together on Sunday mornings? Can we see how great it is when the children of this church seem to begin grasping the idea of Jesus' love and all that has been done for them? Can we see God's blessings in our own families, our circle of friends, our safety and security, our earthly possessions? Can we see these things? We can, because God has given us eyes to see them.

The only danger is that we could become so accustomed to having blessing after blessing laid in our lap, that we will fail to notice. And that is the same as not having eyes to see.

I hope you can find a way, every day, to celebrate all the goodness God has shown to you, and I hope you can find ways to live out your gratefulness for all of God's goodness.



May 2023 Updates

TICKETS FOR RIBFEST ARE NOW ON SALE! They can be purchased at The Link or Community Revival or by going online: http://youarethelink.org/ribfest to place an order. There are 2 options: \$25 tasting ticket (5 ribs and a piece of pie) or \$50 VIP ticket (10 ribs, pie and a drink).

Silent Auction items still needed for RibFest! We have decided to bring back the silent auction to RibFest this year! If you have anything you would like to donate to this, please call Shawna at 320-347-1047. We will also have chance drawings for 2 big ticket items and live music!

Volunteer Opportunities: If you or someone you know would like to be a part of The Link's mission and volunteer at the **Community Revival Boutique and Thrift**, we are looking for extra help on-call and on a consistent basis (mostly Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays). Our store hours are 10-3 Wednesday-Friday and 10-2 Saturdays. Our current volunteers are amazing and have a great time together building friendships. The Food Pantry is also looking for volunteers to help serve families and to help pick up food rescue food from Cashwise and ALDI (Food Rescue is picked up on Monday's). If you'd like to join the fun, call Shawna at 320-347-1047 or Ashley at 320-354-5555.

In April, The Link was able to serve 14 families with common household needs with our **Household Exchange Program**. The Household Exchange program takes in donations such as smaller furniture, bedding, towels, kitchen utensils, pots and pans etc. to provide families when they are getting back on their feet.

The Food Pantry continues to see an increase in need and served 106 households in April (including: 158 adults, 110 children and 37 seniors) and distributed a total of 6403 pounds of food. The need of food has increased significantly the past couple months, requiring The Link to increase their food budget to meet the needs of the people served.

The Wildcat Backpack Program is currently serving 93 children. Each week, students from the NL-S High School pack bags to each school to ensure our students nutritional needs are met on the weekends. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555 or Vicki Mickelson at NLS schools at 320-354-2252 ext. 2607.

The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 6 families in March by helping with transportation, medical bills, utility bills and rental payments. This program also provided advocacy for 6 families, In-depth budgeting support for 11 families, networking for 6 families and provided 14 families with referrals for additional assistance to meet basic needs.

"Blessing Box"

Some of you may have noticed a new small structure that has been placed by the Education Wing door. You might be wondering what this is all about. The Mission Engagement Committee, with the Session's approval, has installed a Blessing Box.

What is a Blessing Box? This structure is intended to be a blessing to those who are struggling with food insecurities when The Link or the Food Shelf is not open. It is also an opportunity for our congregation and community to bless others.

What goes into a Blessing Box? Bibles, Children's Bible story books and non-perishable shelf stable pantry items (no expired items please.)

Anyone can contribute. Simply place the items in the Blessing Box. If it's full, there will be a tote under the mailboxes in the Fellowship Hall for you to place your items. Then, the Blessing Box can be filled whenever it gets low on products.

Anyone can be blessed! However, we are limiting the recipients to just three items at a time, since this is meant to be a temporary solution until The Link or the Food Shelf is once again open.
