Last Wednesday was Ash Wednesday, and that means we have entered the season of Lent, which takes us all the way to Holy Week and Easter. Lent is not everyone's favorite season. Lent's focus on self-reflection and repentance makes it difficult for some to get enthused about it.

And Lent can be a challenge. Maybe you have in the past decided to give something up for Lent. Giving things up is not a favorite pastime for most of us, so if Lent is trying to win a popularity contest among seasons in the church, it will be up against tough competition from Christmas and Easter.

Still, God does call us to repentance, and to be very good at that, we will have to take a serious look at who we are and how we might change things in order to follow Jesus more closely. And so I encourage you to do this. I encourage you to gather with us on Sunday mornings for worship, as Lent is meant to be a season of preparation for Easter.

But if Lent gets you down, because it seems like it emphasizes all the things about yourself that you would rather not emphasize, maybe you can console yourself with the words from the 145th Psalm. Here we find reason to trust our God, even with the truth about ourselves. Remember that God is good to all. Remember that God's love does not depend on you being perfect—or even good. Remember that God has compassion for all that God has made. And that means you.

Many of these duties can be done at home. They are open for volunteers 10 am to 5 pm Monday thru Friday. They also have "Quick" test take home boxes for volunteers to pick up. You take it home, test and clean the items, then bring them back. A quick training will happen at first pick up. We will also have information about our CARE Pantry and pamphlets available for their customers, as we will partner between our ministry and Bargains & Blessings' ministry.

Ribfest 2024 planning has begun.....AND WE WOULD LOVE YOUR HELP! We are currently looking for sponsors and silent auction item donations for the event.

Please save the date.....Saturday, June 8, 2024....in the large city parking lot in New London (behind The Link).

The Food Pantry continues to see an increase in need. In January, The Link served **169 households** - distributing a total of **9,053 pounds of food**.

Wildcat Backpack and Snack Pantry. The Link is currently serving **96 children** each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school. The Link is also currently connecting **29 teachers** with snacks for students in their classroom.

Client Outreach. Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living. In January, your donations were able to support 19 families by helping with medical bills, gas, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. Household Exchange. The Household Exchange Program was able to provide 14 families with much needed winter gear, furniture and other household necessities in January.
