


Thank you for joining the Christian Education Youth and Families Committee in our "Sock Ministry" for our Care Pantry clients!!

community for men; and **The Link** where they were added to Christmas boxes for families. I love thinking about all the "toasty toes" thanks to your generosity!






Maybe you have noticed these beautiful stones near the sanctuary? Joni had her WOW students paint these and then invited the younger class to decorate some too.


