# Hope Scope

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

John 3:16-17 (NRSV)

## At its December 4th meeting, the Session approved the following:

- approved Pastor Jones taking vacation December 25, 2023 through January 2, 2024;
- was informed per capita for 2024 will be \$45 per active member for a total of \$7,425;
- approved participation in the January 27, 2024 Polar Plunge with a team and each participant paying their entry fee and collecting donations for Special Olympics;
- approved inviting Kay Levesque of Parent Life to give a presentation on human trafficking in January;
- approved the Christian Education, Youth and Families Committee holding a retreat on April 13 from 8:30-10:30 a.m.;
- recommended the slate of officers for approval by the congregation;
- approved holding a chili cookoff on Sunday, January 14, 2024, following worship and that a free-will donation be taken for the restroom remodeling projects;
- approve insurance coverage for buildings and contents, umbrella liability and workers' compensation through Lake Region Insurance with a \$10,000 deductible and to pay the annual premium of \$9,851.82 upfront;
- was informed that no one has been found to replace Darlene Bratberg as prayer chain coordinator—effective December 1, 2023. There will be no prayer chain until and unless a replacement is found;
- approved hiring Kristene Foreman as Treasurer for Hope Church beginning January 1, 2024;
- approved recommending to the congregation that Sandy Wersal complete the final year of Kristene Foreman's term on the Session;

 approved the 2024 budget and recommended the congregation approve the Pastor's salary package; rescheduled its January meeting to January 8, 2024.

#### NOVEMBER 2023 IMPACT FROM THE LINK

The Link's Open House Fundraiser was a great success! We are grateful to each and every one of you that came to support The Link and to all of you that have supported The Link's mission so far in 2023!!!!

The Food Pantry continues to see an increase in need. In November, The Link welcomed 27 new families and served 165 households - distributing a total of 10,067 pounds of food.

**Wildcat Backpack and Snack Pantry.** The Link is currently serving **93 children** each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school. The Link is also currently connecting **29 teachers** with snacks for students in their classroom.

Client Outreach. Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living. In November, your donations were able to support **7 families** by helping with medical bills, gas, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. **Household Exchange**. The Household Exchange Program was able to provide **27 families** with much needed winter gear, furniture and other household necessities in November.
