Hope Scope

Now the LORD came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!"

And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening.

1Samuel 3:10 (NRSV)

This is an important time for our church. In many ways, what happens here in the coming months will determine our direction for a good while. I think I notice that people are getting a bit tired. There are many people in this church who do so much. I have always been a believer in doing fewer things, but doing them the best we can, rather than doing more things and letting the quality of our work slide a bit, all the while exhausting everybody in the church.

So, in 1Samuel, the young Samuel is being called by God, and at first he's not aware of it, but then the priest, Eli, tells him how to respond to God's call. And the words above are what Eli tells Samuel to say when God calls: Speak, for your servant is listening.

Presbyterians have long believed that we are called to certain work, in our lives, in our families, and in the church. And it is important for us to respond to that call in something like the way young Samuel was taught: Speak, for your servant is listening. But what if we are just tired? What if we just finished some big project at the church and there is a call, from God, or from the pastor, or from a committee, to do some more work? It can become a problem for us.

We are embarking on an effort with our denomination to try to plot a course for our church over the next years. It is called the Vital Churches Initiative. There are just a handful of churches in the country doing this, and the session and I think the program may hold great promise for us.

One thing that is nice about focusing our efforts is that we may be able to let some things go that have been consuming resources, but that may no longer be helpful for a church in our position. Letting things go can be freeing, but it can also be difficult—sometimes very difficult.

One thing that we hope can come out of this program is that we will be limiting our work to the things that really move our mission and our ministry forward. So, possibly, your phone will ring less often with someone asking for your help, and possibly we can focus our energy and imagination on the most important things. And maybe when your phone does ring, you will be inclined to respond as Samuel did: Speak, for your servant is listening.

At its June 5th meeting, the Session:

- * Approved Pastor Jones taking vacation June 30-July 7.
- * Received a report from Treasurer Jerry Bents that year-to-date, the church's income has a deficit of \$24,354.50.
- * Approved the following for the Christian Education, Youth and Families Committee:
- * TAG taking a mission trip to Minneapolis June 11-13, staying overnight at New Life Presbyterian Church, Roseville, and ending with a trip to Valley Fair;
 - * Adding a children's corner to the Fellowship Hall;
- * Donating any contributions from the summer Family Fun Festivals to Foster Stitches; and
- * Youth mission trips to the Kandiyohi County Food Shelf and Hawk Creek Animal Shelter in Willmar, followed by a fun time at the Dorothy Olson Aquatic Center on a date to be determined.
- * Approved the Mission Engagement Committee planning for and taking a weeklong (7 days/6 nights) mission trip to Belize during the winter of 2024 or 2025 and approve any fundraising needed for the trip.
- * Approved Rev. Dr. Jones planning and leading a week-long group trip to the Holy Land in early 2024.
- * Approved the Restroom Task Force remodeling the bathrooms in the Christian Education wing at an estimated cost of \$1,660 to be taken from the Building Fund and to continue fundraising to offset the costs.
- * Approved Ye Olde Mill Inn using the east end of the church parking lot for overflow parking for busy weekends when it does not have space and to avoid using it Sunday mornings during worship services.
 - Changed the next Session meeting to Monday, July 10.

June 2023 Updates

RibFest 2023 was a HUGE success! The Link raised over \$27,000 to help families and children in need- right here in your community! The weather was perfect and the turn-out was amazing! Thank you to all who came out to support The Link during it's biggest fundraiser of the year! We couldn't have done it without you!

Best of the Best!!! The Link and Community Revival Boutique and Thrift were voted "Runner-Up" for Best of the Best 2023! We are humbled and grateful for all of the support!

Deb Ostlund has been hired for the new Support Staff position! Deb worked for over 24 years for Kandiyohi County. She has 2 adult daughters and has lived in the NL-S/Willmar area for many years-so she is very familiar with the community! She shares our love to serve others and we are excited to have her join the team! Stop in and introduce yourself if you're in the neighborhood!

Volunteer Opportunities: If you or someone you know would like to be a part of The Link's mission and volunteer at the: **Community Revival Boutique and Thrift**, we are looking for extra help on-call and on a consistent basis (mostly Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays). Our store hours are 10-3 Wednesday-Friday and 10-2 Saturdays. Our current volunteers are amazing and have a great time together building friendships. The Food Pantry is also looking for volunteers to help serve families and to help pick up food rescue food from Cashwise and ALDI (Food Rescue is picked up on Monday's). In May, The Link was able to serve 10 families with common household needs with our **Household Exchange Program**. The Household Exchange program takes in donations such as smaller furniture, bedding, towels, kitchen utensils, pots and pans etc. to provide families when they are getting back on their feet.

The Food Pantry continues to see an increase in need and served 124 households in May (including: 200 adults, 108 children and 35 seniors) and distributed a total of 6000.1 pounds of food. The need of food has increased significantly the past couple months, requiring The Link to increase their food budget to meet the needs of the people served.

The Wildcat Backpack Program finished up the school year serving 93 children weekly at NL-S. Each week, students from the NL-S High School pack bags to each school to ensure our students nutritional needs are met on the weekends. Summer packs will be available for families if they stop in at The Link and request them. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555 or Vicki Mickelson at NLS schools at 320-354-2252 ext. 2607.

The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 10 families in May by helping with transportation, medical bills, utility bills and rental payments. This program also provided advocacy for 7 families, In-depth budgeting support for 10 families, networking for 8 families and provided 10 families with referrals for additional assistance to meet basic needs.


